

## AFAS-2024 SEED RESEARCH GRANT: CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

### APPLICATION SELECTION CRITERIA

#### APPLICATION DEADLINE: 25 December 2024

# 1. Non-negotiable Criteria

If any of three criteria below is not met, the application will immediately be removed.

- 1. Proof of registration/proof of employment. Must be registered/employed by a university or research institution located in Africa.
- 2. Must be a PhD student or early-career researcher (having completed their PhD within the past five years of the grant application deadline).
- 3. Must be conducting their PhD in the field of astronomy.

# 2. Other Detailed Criteria

Motivational letter	25%
Recommendation letter	15%
Inclusion & Diversity	5%
Transcripts, CV and publications	10%

## 2.1. Quality of Research Proposal

Below are some of the key selection criteria which the reviewing panel will use when evaluating the proposal. Each criterion is weighted either 0, 1 or 2, where 0 is not available, 1 is stated but not clear/sufficient, and 2 is well and clearly presented. The weighting of the following rests solely at the discretion of the reviewer. The key selection criteria are as follows:

1. Title of research project.



- 2. Clearly stated research questions.
- 3. Clearly stated aim/project goal(s).
- 4. Justification for undertaking the project (project relevance to the domain).
- 5. Clearly defined methodology.
- 6. Clearly stated impact of the results.
- 7. A proposed timeline.
- 8. Project feasibility.
- 9. Is the budget aligned with the call for application?
- 10. Is the budget allocation and breakdown reasonable?
- 11. Other project outputs (paper, talk, thesis).
- 12. Activities and initiatives in promoting astronomy through school outreach, social media or other similar initiatives.
- 13. Membership to international collaborations (particularly those across Africa).

#### 2.2 Past Performance and Academic Track Records of an Applicant.

- 1. Academic excellence based on transcripts.
- 2. Academic publication as a first/second author

## 2.3 Motivational Letter

The following criteria will be evaluated when reviewing the motivational letter written by the applicant. Each point can be weighed either 0, 1 and 2, where 0 is not available, 1 is stated but not clear/sufficient, and 2 is clearly stated and reasonable.

- 1. Name, current position and institution of the applicant.
- 2. Project's name.
- 3. Project's purpose (what the project aims to accomplish).
- 4. Reasons why they require funding. Justify the amount of money being requested. Provide a budget breakdown indicating how the funds will be allocated and used. The maximum amount requested is 1200 EUR for the project outlined in the research proposal.
- 5. The amount of funding being sought and a breakdown of expenses (budget) for the project.
- 6. Motivation for the support in a statement explaining how the funding will impact their project.
- 7. Impact of their project to their domain and interest of AfAS.

#### 2.4 Recommendation Letter



We encourage the reviewer to evaluate the recommendation letter using the following key items/questions. Each criterion should be given either a 0, 1 or 2. Here 0 means not available, 1 stated but not clear/sufficient and 2 is clearly stated and reasonable/relevant.

- 1. The referee in full support of the candidate
- 2. The referee has explained how and when they met the Candidate and described their academic relationship
- 3. The referee properly highlights the candidate's academic excellence which is relevant to the application
- 4. The referee highlights the candidate's research potential
- 5. The referee briefly described the candidate's intended research focus and goals
- 6. The referee highlights the project's originality and the potential contributions to the broader scientific community

### A minimum of two recommendation letters are required for a complete application.

#### 2.5 Inclusion & Diversity.

The following are some of the inclusion and diversity metrics we are considering:

- Gender.
- Geographic location and institution.
